Interline Transfers

To Waukesha Metro Transit:
Interline transfers are available from your **Wisconsin Coach Lines** operator. These transfers will allow you to transfer to a Waukesha Metro Transit bus for no additional fare. Waukesha Metro Transit transfers will not be issued to passengers boarding with a **Wisconsin Coach Lines** transfer except on Routes 1 and 2 at the Goerkes Corners Park & Ride stop.

Upon boarding first bus, the passenger should request an interline transfer from the driver. The issued transfer is time and date validated by the issuing driver. The transit passenger should present this transfer to the driver of the vehicle they are transferring to at the time of boarding.

From Waukesha Metro Transit:
Wisconsin Coach Lines will accept Waukesha Metro Transit transfers. These transfers will allow you to transfer to a **Wisconsin Coach Lines** bus for **\$1.25** plus the transfer.

To Milwaukee County Transit System (MCTS):
MCTS will accept **Wisconsin Coach Lines** transfers for **\$0.50** off the applicable fare.

From Milwaukee County Transit System (MCTS):
Wisconsin Coach Lines will accept the MCTS M Card for **\$0.50** off the applicable fare. Please note that Commuter Values Passes will not be accepted as a transfer.

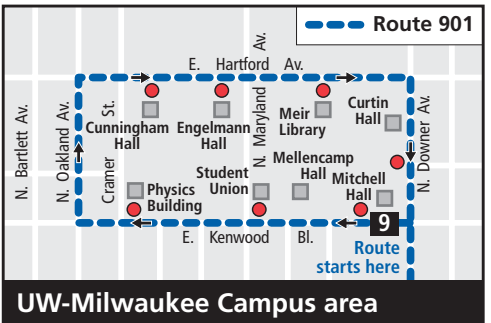
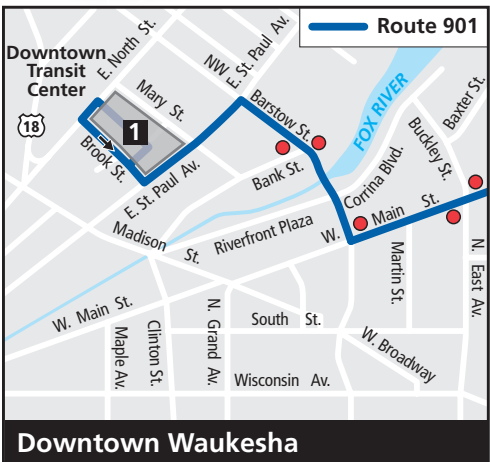
Lost and Found

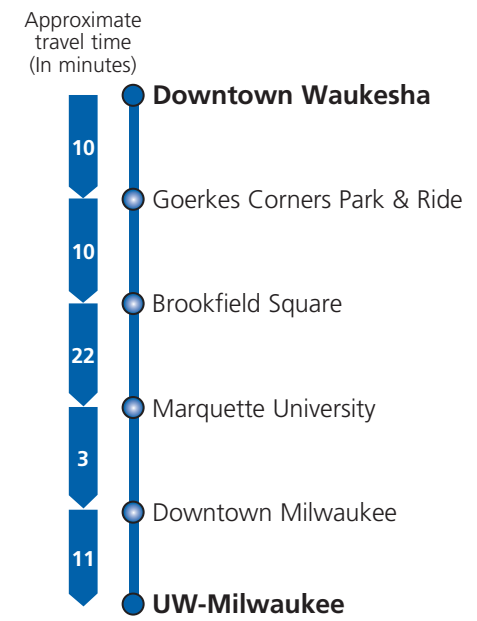

Commuter Book Discount

We offer a commuter book which consists of 10 one-way tickets at a 10% discount from the normal adult fare. Commuter Books are sold only at Wisconsin Coach Lines Ticket Agent locations (see right).

How to Ride the Waukesha County Express

- 1 Please wait by the Wisconsin Coach Lines or blue route number bus stop sign a few minutes before the bus is scheduled to arrive. For pickup, in downtown Milwaukee, signal to driver by raising arm.
2 When the bus arrives, check the sign in the windshield for the route number and name. If you are still unsure if you have the correct bus, ask the driver.
3 Pay your fare. Please have your fare ready before you board the bus. Cash & Tickets: Put bills, coins, or tickets into the farebox. Exact change is required. If you need an interline transfer, request one from the driver.
4 Take a seat and watch for your stop. No passenger or their carry-on is allowed to occupy more than one seat to the exclusion of other passengers. Overhead storage is available for extra carry-on items.
5 Wait until the bus comes to a complete stop and depart the bus.
6 No smoking, eating or drinking on the bus.

Reading the Schedule

- 1 Find the schedule for the direction you wish to ride.
2 Find the timepoints closest to your origin and destination. The timepoints are shown on the route map and indicate the time the bus is scheduled to be at the particular location. Your nearest bus stop may be between timepoints.
3 Read down the column to see the times when a trip will be at the given timepoint. Read the times across to the right to see when the trip reaches other timepoints. If no time is shown, that trip does not serve that timepoint.
